WRS Health performed a software update on January 24, 2015. The release included the addition of LDM information to existing prescribing functionality:

Patient Medication Information & Savings

The LDM Group is industry-leading company that offers information and discount offers on medications as a service to prescribers, pharmacists and patients. WRS prescribers can access and print this medication information and savings offers for patients at the time of the encounter.

LDM Information When Prescribing

LDM information can be accessed under **EMR>Medications>Current Note Prescriptions**. If a new prescription is added to the note, and that medication is included in the LDM database, an LDM icon



will then appear:

Clicking the LDM icon will open a new window/tab. This window will contain information about the medication and savings offers. Pressing print enables the prescriber to print the medication data and give it to their patient.

LDM Information at Checkout

LDM data is also available during the checkout process. As applicable, the **Print Rx Materials** button will appear when a newly-prescribed medication for that patient is identified in the LDM database. Pressing **Print Rx Materials** will open a new window/tab and display medication information and savings offers. Prescribers and staff can print this information for the patient.
